


March 2024 - News from Pensacola Beach Yacht Club

We literally could not be making this happen without the help of our volunteers. I say this every night, to almost everyone who comes in - please tip them generously. I don't think any of them care much about the money but the appreciation factor means a lot!

So, when are we getting our liquor license? We have received our designation as a non-profit civic organization and our application will soon be moving to the department of alcohol, tobacco, and firearms for what is hopefully the final approval. We still have to pass a health inspection and fire inspection but we are close to finishing the required tasks for both of those things.

This brings up a very important topic. We have been operating on donations and good will and haven't been enforcing a lot of rules. Once we have our liquor license, this changes. State law requires a few things such as members signing in themselves and guests, no outside alcohol being allowed in the club, no one not working allowed behind the bar, and adhering to the law on many topics, as required. This is the price we have to pay for being a fully functioning club and I'm going to trust that you all understand this and work with us on it. Moving on to some housekeeping topics: we do now have a weekly cleaning service for the bathrooms which is wonderful! Your volunteer bartenders and board members are cleaning everything outside of the bathrooms so please make sure your trash makes it to the cans and you are mindful of their time and effort. If you are looking for a volunteer opportunity and cleaning/organizing is

your cuppa tea, contact me. I need you.

We have at least 3 member artists who are currently displaying their work in the club house. This work is for sale and can be purchased at the bar. The club retains a percentage of the sale so this is a great way to show support for both the club and the member artists.

We are finalizing the details for the event space rentals. We already have several dates on the calendar and hope to be able to present the big picture to you in next months spreader. The event space represents a revenue stream for the club and a benefit for you so we are really excited about it! If you are looking at having an event, please contact me to discuss.
